121/18	Apologies for Absence Cllr Ian Beadles Cllr Lucy Sole	
122/18	Minutes of the Meeting held on Monday 2nd July were accepted as a correct record and signed.	
123/18	Matters Arising not on the Agenda None	
124/18	<p>First Open Session</p> <p>Cllr Roger Blaney (NSDC) Councillor Blaney expressed his concerns about the new bus timetable. He advised that this was a matter for NCC to address. He was asked about train capacity and answered that this was one criteria being asked of the companies applying for the new franchise. He was questioned once again about the lack of trains going straight through to Lincoln thus avoiding a long wait in Newark where there is no shelter. The length of time taken for barriers being down was commented upon.</p> <p>Cllr Sue Saddington (Notts CC) Cllr Saddington was asked about the plan being considered by NCC to create a Unitary Authority. She explained that such a move would involve dissolving both the County Council and all District Councils and would be a lengthy process. It was noted that the population of the County is much larger than that which the Government had indicated would be considered for Unitary status, but Nottingham City Council had also indicated a wish to expend their current boundary, which would reduce the numbers. It was reported that the road in Fiskerton is to be resurfaced. Cllr Saddington is to donate £250 towards the Seniors' lunch, which would be paid to the PC initially. The tour of Britain Cycle Race is passing through the County on Saturday 8th Sept. It was announced that funding had been approved in the current financial year for an Interactive Speed Sign to be installed in the village and that NCC Highways engineers had visited the village and identified a suitable site with access to power facing traffic approaching from Staythorpe. Much discussion took place regarding the planned location. The Parish Council made a request for funding for a second Interactive Sign facing traffic approaching from Fiskerton and Cllr Saddington confirmed that she would put this forward .</p>
