I submit that the judgements behind the production of the options report in previous versions and the updated risk assessment 2023 on respective criteria no 3, 6, 7 and 14 are unsound and not based on proportionate evidence in relation to NUA/Ho10. Specifically :

In relation to objective 3 'to provide better opportunities for people to value and enjoy the districts heritage'. The affected area is one of the last unimproved country lanes in the Balderton area bordering rich mature hedgerows with the site itself composed of ridge and furrow grassland and mature tree lines .This development will result in the loss of this heritage and irreversibly spoil this country lane character It is erroneously scored as a 0 no impact when it should be at best a – (single minus). A petition of 2000 signatures proves that this area is of significant cultural value to local people and this has simply been ignored by the council

In relation to objective 6 to increase biodiversity levels across the district it is scored –, (single minus) however the loss of several hectares of species rich grassland which is a national priority habitat, occupied by several list one species and further protected species which will also impact on the adjoining 3 Local wildlife site merits a - -, (double minus), score , as has been pointed out by several other respondents.

Moreover, this is in direct conflict with current government policy under the Environmental Improvement Plan EIP 23, to 'leave nature in a better state than we find it'. It is in direct conflict with NPPF and statutory consultee advice by not applying Biodiversity net gain BNG , moreover the application of the current BNG metric would conclude there are areas of such high value – species rich grassland - that they cannot be compensated for and should be retained.

The presence of several list 1 species breeding barn owls within 100 m of the site, and large flocks of winter redwings and field fares Tawny owls and many other list 1 species . there are also 10 's of UK red list species present song thrush, redwing, spotted flycatcher, linnets fieldfares and others that use this rich habitat to feed and breed . recent nest success include a brood of 4 barn owls , 4 kestrels and 1 tawny owl . There is a facebook 'Balderton Wildlife' group started in May 23 centred around Lowfield Lane which now has over 700 members to record and enjoy the amazing wildlife this area has to offer so close to our community . a recent bat survey in Sept 23 by the local bat group revealed 6 species of bat present including the rare Nathusius Pipistrelle , which is arguably no surprise for habitat of this quality and location . The allocation of this area will seriously detract from this and has simply been ignored by the council despite its own ecological survey supporting this high value . The site borders local wildlife sites-LWS - on 3 sides and presents a significant impact of disturbance, encroachment and fragmentation of this nation important Public Habitat inventory PHI designated area. Moreover it infers that the quality of the

actual allocation site is of equal national significance as species rich grassland of which we have lost 97 % . there is a strong case to designate parts of the site as Local wildlife site in it own right as has been stated by others

In relation to objective 7 to protect and enhance the rich diversity of the natural, cultural and built environment and archaeological assets of the district it is bizarrely listed as a + implying some benefit and no impact which is clearly wrong when we have a petition of 2000 local people clearly opposing this development because it is so special and important to them and the aforementioned reasons. It is simply destroying 7 hectares of irreplaceable heritage, land form , hedge boundary , ridge and furrow and pushing this accessible very well used green space area further away from our community . no evidence has been offered to support the scoring which is completely unsound .

I have further considered the conflict of the allocation plan to be in conflict with statutory advice and government policy and the National planning policy framework in a separate submission for clarity for the inspector

The inclusion of the additional parcel of land on to the west of the site in this updated plan which takes the capacity from 120 houses to 170 houses should be subjected to scrutiny as it was not included in the original allocation and should be considered in the light of current govt and planning policy not considered as part of the original allocation granted back in 2012/13.
