Leave No Litter – Teacher Notes

These notes are for guidance in using the Leave No Litter Presentation and accompanying resources as part of the Leave No Litter Signage Competition open to pupils in years 3 - 7.

Please adapt the resources for use with your pupils where necessary.

What you will need:

- Leave No Litter Competition Presentation for use on a smart board
- Whiteboards/ paper and pens for group work
- Timeline Cards (one set per group A4 size)
- Pledge Against Littering Cards
- Bin it Bingo Cards for litter picking
- Leave No Litter Signage Template (these will be delivered to schools taking part as they are on special cardstock for designing!)

Presentation and Resources

The presentation has pausing points throughout to ask questions and have pupils collaboratively complete short activities.

There are opportunities to support and extend pupils' learning with some of the resources provided in the pack should you wish to.

Competition

We cannot collect pupil names and ask that you assign each child a reference number so that if they win, we can contact your school and let you know using this reference number.

Please use your last name and number the pupils from 1 – 30. For example, <u>DAVIES</u>01

Artwork should be drawn within the box on the Signage Template and coloured in (preferably) using **felt tip pens or paints**.

The text they would like to accompany their artwork (their slogan/ message) should be written on the lines beneath their artwork as this will be added on by our design team to keep consistency across the signs.

We invite pupils to create an eye-catching and informative piece of art to highlight the dangers of littering on our environment. We will be selecting a variety of these to be printed as **stickers for street bins** and as **fixed signage in some of our local parks and green spaces** next to rivers and lakes. Your pupils' work could be on display and helping to make a difference very soon!

Pupils should consider one of the problems from the presentation to help highlight how binning our rubbish is beneficial to our planet. They could show the dangers of littering for our wildlife in our parks and on our streets. They might want to show how litter enters storm drains, rivers, lakes, and the ocean, causing harm to marine life. Maybe they want to show how easy it is to bin rubbish – there are many options to choose from!
